New Certificate in Road Safety

The European Directive on Road Infrastructure Management requires that by 2013 road safety auditors working on the Trans European Road Network (TERN) will need to undergo road safety engineering training resulting in the award of a "certificate of competence". From June 2010 delegates attending the 10 day RoSPA-TMS Road Safety Engineering course will be able to gain such a Certificate of Competence which will fulfil the requirement of the European Directive for undertaking RSAs on the TERN. Those wishing to take up this option will attend week 1 of the course with the other delegates. On the final afternoon they will sit a multiple choice knowledge test, based on subjects covered in week 1. Those taking the certificate will then attend the first two days of week 2 with the other delegates, during which time they will analyse collision data and visit the collision location. They will then leave the course and write up the study report as individuals. They will be subsequently submit this report along with a completed Safety Audit report, to the course tutors for assessment. The RoSPA Certificate of Competence will fulfil the requirement of the European Directive for undertaking RSA in the future on the TERN.

IHE welcomed the TMS initiative. Tony Sharp, Institute President, said: "RoSPA is recognised as the leading road safety course, but we all know that in a more demanding world attendance is not enough – we need professionals whose knowledge and competence has been properly assessed. The IHE Register of Road Safety with its annual CPD check on competence and its adherence to a code of professional conduct brings added value to the RoSPA Certificate and we hope successful candidates will sign up to the Register."
